Parent Training

One of the goals we have as an organization is to empower the local communities we serve in. This year we launched a new aspect of our YICA Child program: The Parents' Training. We have a hope and a goal to equip parents to be financially independent to where their children no longer need to be sponsored for school. We see our sponsorship program as a temporary assistance to these families, and have a goal to uplift and train the parents of the children in areas that contribute to poverty and financial independence. Some of the topics we teach are: optimizing farming, cash crops, personal financial management (saving, investing, and budgeting), job skills, overcoming addictions, solving interpersonal conflicts, and family management. We will hold a training every 3-4 months.

On the 10th of March we launched our first training with the parents. 36 of the parents attended our full day session. We used the morning to have a training on the program Farming God's Way. We partnered with Jenga who sent us a facilitator to lead the teaching and demonstrations. The trainer was very knowledgeable and was able to explain and show new techniques of farming (which parents are starting to do in their gardens!). In the afternoon, James and Kelsey Magomu led a session on the importance of savings and ways to save. The parents were engaged all throughout the training and we very appreciative. One father said at the end of the training, "Organizations always forget about us parents, and it's important for us to be trained and for us to work together."

Youth Chat aims to create a space for youth to:


- a. Develop their relationship with God, mentors, and peers
