Greetings from Uganda! We hope you are well.

Mbale and Sironko has been fine overall. However, in July, there was much rain, and it caused serious flooding. It caught everyone by surprise, and devastation came quickly. 23 people died due to the flooding and mudslides. Some cars were washed off the road, bodas swept away, bridges broken, and homes destroyed.

The Ugandan government estimates that 80 people lost their homes, 800 homes were damaged, and 5000 acres of food ruined.

Please remain in prayer over those effected by the floods.

We also prepared a table full of traditional food to share with them such as matoke (a type of plantain), rice, chicken, beef, greens, potatoes, and malaiwa (bamboo).

Josephine and Kathy were able to spend the whole day together, and exchanged gifts with one another. Kathy left, leaving all our hearts full of encouragement.

As the Christmas season is approaching, our YICA Child team has a hope to support the local families in our program by supplying a Christmas food basket to each of them. Costs of living has severely increased in Uganda, and in an effort to help make sure each family has some basic needs met, our team raised the idea of providing a simple Christmas food basket. Our hope is to include rice, sugar, tea, salt, soap, and smearing oil. Each basket is estimated to cost around \$8.50 or 30,000 UGX. Truthfully, we really need partners to join us to provide these items. Most of our programs are funded by the team themselves (which we count a great joy!), but we need others to join with us in the vision and the burden.

Church Leaders Training

In August, we held a 3 day church leaders training with church members from Buyobo Chosen Church. We called for 10 leaders to come to Mbale to stay over the weekend.

The emphasis of this training was building healthy relationships with the "4 Persons." Person 1 is the Lord. We discussed with leaders how to have quiet time, how to read the Bible and use its resources, and understanding prayer and fasting. Person 2 is the family. We discussed the importance of being present in your family, ministering to your family, and being a supportive spouse and parent. Person 3 represents the church. We discussed how to create healthy boundaries in the church, how to lead the church, how to start small groups, and living out Biblical leadership. Person 4 represents the greater community. We learned how to share the Gospel, how to reach out to the community, and how to be a light around.

We had various facilitators who came to teach. Local ministers, local missionaries, and teachers all came to lead discussions with the Buyobo Chosen Church group. We found facilitators of various backgrounds to come and lead discussions.

At the end of the training, we supplied each church leader with a study Bible and certificate. Joy was abundant.





A Note from our Director



"Recently I went to my uncle's burial and I was amazed how many people had been touched to follow Christ Jesus and join Ministry because of his life and ministry. But 61 years ago when he begun active ministry, much of the conditions around were not perfect ranging from standards of living, modes of transport, level of literacy, financial provisions, weather conditions, security, health systems to ministry resources. These were real factors, but when God called him, he begun the journey straight forward. As YICA, we have and will continue to obey and do the calling we heard from God on the 20th June 2014, even when all situations are not perfect yet. There is much we shall never know or have control over but only God will. I would love to encourage all of us to take small steps of faith to walk into the big place (calling) that the Lord is calling you to.
